Third Sunday in Advent A 2025

John was arrested and was kept in the dark of a dungeon. It is a surprise that in today's Gospel, John asks Jesus, "Are you really the One we are waiting for?" Some commentators over the years have suggested that maybe John was asking the question for the benefit of his followers. But there is no evidence for that. We rarely think of John as someone who retained his own disciples after the beginning of Jesus' ministry and many people thought that he is the Messiah (LK. 3:15). There is no suggestion that John thought of himself as the Messiah, yet we know that twenty years after the death of Jesus there were still disciples of John – some of whom were received into the Church when they heard about the Holy Spirit for the first time (Acts 19).

In today's Gospel John is genuinely puzzled. He had spoken so powerfully in his preaching, "Behold, the Lamb of God who takes away the sin of the world" (Jn. 1:29). And now John was baffled. The Hebrew prophecies about the Messiah came in many forms. Some, like Isaiah in today's first reading, spoke about the time of Messiah as the time of restoration and peace. Others saw the Messiah as a warrior, a commander, as John described last week, laying the axe to the roots of unproductive trees and cutting them down. Now John is in prison, and he does not hear anything about cleansing battles or the sound of shock and awe.

With many people of that time, John probably expected Jesus to take away the sin of the world in a clean sweep, in one huge, fierce military battle. A new world order would then come suddenly. In jail, John could see the approaching end of his own life. So, he sent his disciples to Jesus with this question.

When we read the News Paper or watch TV news we may ask the same question sometimes. "Shall we look for another savior because His power seems to be weak in our world?" To us and John He gives this answer about the healing, transformation, the power of the Gospel given to the poor. The message Jesus sends to John and to us is that the power of Christ's coming is found not in the sound and fury of battle but in the changes within human heart and lives.

We see the power of Christ's coming at Christmas most vividly not in the brightness of our lights, the glitter of our decorations, the sound of the choir, the size of the tree or the number of gifts. The power of Christ's coming is shown in His entry into human lives to dwell there as a source of strength, faith and redemption. The real miracles of the Messiah occur every day within human heart. The real power of Christmas is manifested on the inside rather than on the outside. It is easy for us to mistake material prosperity for spiritual vitality, outer decoration for inner dignity and seasonal cheer for spiritual joy.

The inner change that Jesus came to bring about in the human soul is the necessary condition for any abiding change in the world. A corrupt heart will corrupt everything it touches. A healed heart can heal its environment. Sin in the humanity, pride and envy in the heart, the anger that makes people furious or in general human weakness cannot be destroyed by sword or gun. Many people and mythologies of religion tried it but could not. That is why Jesus took human form and accepted human weakness and sin and nailed it on the cross; as St. Paul says, "For our sake He (God) made Him (Jesus) to be sin who did not know sin, so that we might become the righteousness of God in Him" (2 Cor. 5: 21). Those who allow Him and His grace to enter into the heart and soul will receive the power and strength to deal with human weakness.

Part of the deep joy of Advent and Christmas comes from our knowledge that the Messiah came to bring life to the dead places in our heart, to help us recover spiritual vitality in our soul to remove the desert of sin in our lives. The Messiah that John awaited did indeed come to do battle not with the Romans but with the power of sin; not in the plains of Palestine but in every human heart; not once but in every generation. The Messiah in Christ is not a miracle worker or a problem solver, but he is there in our life to help us to do miracles and to solve our problem with his help and presence.


