

Novena to St. Andrew

Advent always begins on the Sunday closest to November 30th, the feast day of <u>St. Andrew</u> the Apostle. Is this just a nice coincidence, or is there deeper significance?

There is indeed a deeper significance. St. Andrew was the very first disciple called by Our Lord—that is why, in the Orthodox tradition, he is known by the name $\Pi \rho \omega \tau \delta \kappa \lambda \eta \tau \sigma \zeta$, which means "First-Called." Andrew is the one who convinced his brother, Simon, to become Jesus' disciple. "We have found the Messiah!" Andrew said to him. Now we know Simon as Peter, the first pope. In keeping with his role as "the first-called," the feast of St. Andrew is found at the beginning of our new liturgical year.

There are many popular traditions associated with St. Andrew's feast day, especially in those countries that have him as their patron saint: Scotland and Russia.

But the most popular St. Andrew's feast day tradition is for everyone. This tradition is a Christmas novena that begins on St. Andrew's feast day. It is believed that whoever recites this prayer 15 times a day from the feast of St. Andrew until Christmas will obtain what is asked.

CHRISTMAS NOVENA

Hail, and blessed be the hour and the moment in which the Son of God was born of the most pure Virgin Mary, at midnight in Bethlehem, in the piercing cold. In that hour vouchsafe, O my God to hear my prayer and grant my desires, through the merits of our Savior Jesus Christ, and of His blessed Mother, Amen

First Sunday in Advent Cycle A 2025

Today we begin the season of Advent, a time of expectation and hope when we look forward to celebrating the birth of Christ. In our culture, Advent has developed a split personality as a time of light and of shadow. On one hand, Advent is a season of dazzling secular light and it is also a time of spiritual quieting as we are called to look within. Our culture says, "Get busy" and the church says "Quiet down" to prepare for Christmas.

The Prophet Isaiah speaks about the dream of God about this world which is to be perfectly fulfilled. According to his description, a day will come, when "all nations will stream towards the house of the Lord", and "all will take instructions from the Lord and walk in his path". His instructions will be on justice, and his path will be love. Above all, in his reign, "one nation will not raise sword against another.... Peace will reign, everlasting peace, never to be broken to pieces.

Will this happen? If yes, when will it happen? But most of the time what we see and hear in the world is doom as the gospel says, "When two men are at work, one will be taken, and the other will be left".

God inaugurated his reign in and through the first coming of Jesus and it is already in the world. Advent is the time to get into reign of God for us. Paul gives us the means to get into the reign of God, "Cast off the deeds of darkness and put the armor of light". It is good time to take on the personal practice of fast and abstinence during Advent. It is a good time to prepare a thorough confession to renew ourselves in grace. It is a good time to start the family practice of gathered prayer at least before dinner. It is a good time to revive old friendships, restore broken connections and heal family rifts (or try to). It is a good time to make sure we spend time with our families. It is a good time to liberate ourselves from temptations. It is a good time to open our hearts to the light of Christ to come to our lives. The transforming power of Christmas mystery is found not in the changes that happen on the outside but changes that happen within.

The four readings remind us that the world is a place where God is very active. It is a dangerous world, but one in which safety can be found by those who open themselves to God's grace. Christ came among us to satisfy the deepest longings of the human heart. One of the longings is for peace – peace among nations, peace in our families and peace in ourselves. Some of that peace seems far away. When Isaiah speaks of nations beating their sword into plowshares, it sounds like wishful thinking. But that is what hope is all about, the refusal to give into despair. A wise man once observed that people who suffer from sorrow or depression are often unable to imagine a world different from the one in which they find themselves. Advent and Christmas remind us that by the grace of God we can have a better world, a better family and a better self. God has joined us in the struggle to make it happen. This is another chance to cast off the deeds of darkness and experience once more a light that lasts.

We are between two times: between the first coming of Jesus and His second coming on the last day. We remember the first; we wait for the second. We wait and hope for the coming of the Lord with power and live with Him here who came in human form and weakness. In His first coming the world was very busy and he didn't get a place to be born. The situation has not changed even now. We want him to be born now. But where? Is it in our family or in our heart? Our heart and family are full — with anxieties, worries of sickness and old age, family problems, human weaknesses... St. Paul says, "Cast off the deeds of darkness and put the armor of light." We try and it seems to be impossible. Can we give a small place in our busy heart of family to the Lord to be born. In his first coming at least he got a manger. If we can spare a small, unimportant place, he will begin to work from there. That will be a new beginning. It is as the prophet lasiah said, "he instructs us in his ways, and we may walk in his paths."


