Seventeenth Sunday in Ordinary Times Cycle 2025

All the readings of today's Mass are about prayer. How does a person pray? Prayer is a natural and spontaneous activity. We pray for anything and everything. The disciples who might have prayed according to the Jewish faith and tradition once asked the Lord to teach them how to pray. He replied, when you pray say like this, and taught them the prayer "our Father", a universal prayer. Even though the story in the first reading presents before us a compassionate, loving and patient God, in general the Old Testament God is a tribal God, that is, He is the God of Israel. Several times He is referred to as God of Abraham, God of Isaac and God of Jacob. He is presented not as a universal God, even though there are few references as the universal God who seeks the salvation of all. Therefore, we see a God most of the time stands for the good of Israel, defending and protecting them. The exile from Egypt, capturing the Promised Land, destruction of Jericho, destroying and killing everything and everybody there are few examples. But when Jesus came, He taught that the God of Israel is the God of universe and everyone irrespective of Jews or Gentiles can call Him, Father. Therefore, the Lord gives us the prayer "our Father" calling God our Father. The Jews had the strongest sense of God's immensity: "the Most High" "the Holy One..." "As the heavens are higher than the earth, so are my ways higher than your ways and my thoughts than your thoughts" (Is. 55:8,9). Christianity appeared first as a "mystery religion." Christians did not speak about the inner mysteries to outsiders. Certain things were revealed to the initiate on the vigil of their baptism. The Our Father was one of those mysteries. Tertullian (born about 160 AD) prepared them for that moment when they would address God for the first time as Father. "You blessed ones, for whom the grace of God is waiting, when you come up from that washing of the new birth, and when for the first time you spread out your hands with your brothers and sisters in your mother's house (the Church), ask of your Father... for special graces...'Ask' Jesus says, 'and you shall receive.' So now, you have sought and have found. You have knocked, and it has been open to you. "The prayer 'Our Father' is itself a powerful prayer and it is also a model of all Christian prayers whatever the words might be. It is also a great prayer of unity, the one prayer that all Christians around the world have in common. A great deal can be said about the Lord's Prayer because it is both a prayer and a school of prayer. We can reflect on intimacy, the surrender and the trust it displays. There is, first of all, its intimacy. Jesus says that when we Christians pray, we should say "our Father". As Christians we have a special relationship with the Father through His Son. We can speak to the Father its all the familiarity that implies. He is also Father of us all. God is "our Father". St. Paul teaches us in today's second reading that we can speak to the Father as Jesus did because we share the very life of Jesus through Baptism. We become in Baptism what Jesus was by nature. Baptism has endowed us with a new, powerful relationship with Father that nothing else in creation has. Therefore, we can confidently and intimately call Him "our Father". Secondly, the Lord's Prayer teaches us to surrender. The first group of petitions acknowledge that God's name must be hallowed, His kingdom has priority and Matthew's Gospel adds that His will must be done. We give ourselves to the care and providence of the Father. We might not fully understand what is happening in our life or why, but we trust that God is also present. Ultimately, He is our peace. How many times have we surrendered our mind and soul to His will and received His peace. Finally, the Lord's Prayer concludes with a series of petitions through which we present all our needs to the Father with loving confidence. This prayer teaches us to trust God. The parable also says to us we must approach God our Father with the confidence of the children who know they are loved. Total trust in a loving Father, confidence in His providence and persistence in our prayer can open the door to our needs. This is the message that the parable gives us. We see these elements of intimacy, surrender and trust in the Abraham prayers in today's first reading. Therefore, , let us keep these words in our mind whenever we are ready to pray – intimacy, surrender and trust.



This season, we celebrate the fire of the Holy Spirit and the birth of the Church—a powerful reminder that God continues to breathe new life into His people today. 
