FEED YOUR BODY, FEED YOUR SOUL LENTEN PROGRAM PERSONAL PRAYER SERIES SIX VIDEOS BY FR. BONIFACE HICKS, O.S.B.

Prayer is at the heart of the Christian life. Given that we are weak and even sinful human beings, how can it be that God has anything to do with us? What does it

mean to have a personal relationship with God? Why is God so silent and hidden? How do we grow in prayer? Personal Prayer: A Guide for Receiving the Father's Love brings the depth of human experience together with the Catholic tradition of prayer to present the path to an intimate and vulnerable relationship with God. Fr. Boniface Hicks, O.S.B., a Benedictine monk of Saint Vincent Archabbey in Latrobe, PA. Since his ordination to the priesthood in 2004, he has provided spiritual direction for many men and women, including married couples, seminarians, consecrated religious, and priests-even as he completed his Doctorate in computer science at Penn State University. He is the programming manger and an on-air contributor for We Are One Body Catholic radio, and he has recorded thousands of radio programs on theology and the spiritual life. He has extensive experience as a retreat master for laity, consecrated religious, and priests. Mass at 4pm followed by a light meal of soup, bread, and cookies.

The cross of Christ is the hope that cannot ever be because we are always in need of it, especially in the most moments. abandoned difficult

The figures represent humanity from the four corners of the World. They are embracing each other to illustrate the solidarity between the peoples, as the first holds onto the cross.

The Cross, in the shape of a sail, is transformed into an anchor that imposes itself over the waves in motion. A universal symbol of Hope.

The rough sea is a reminder of the difficulties of the pilgrimage of life. Often, personal events as well as those of the world, press on us more intensely, demanding a greater hope.

2025 Jubilee Year, beginning on Christmas Eve 2024 and ending in January 2026. With the theme "Pilgrims of Hope," Pope Francis seeks to rekindle hope and trust in the future, encouraging Catholics to deepen their faith through acts of charity, penance, and pilgrimage.

Archbishop Hartmayer has designated the Church of the Purification of the Blessed Virgin Mary at Heritage, located 240 Washington Road, Crawfordville, GA 30631 (1 hr. from McCormick) as a pilgrimage site for Jubilee 2025: Pilgrims of Hope, ending on the Solemnity of the Epiphany of the Lord on Tuesday, January 6, 2026.

A plenary indulgence can be obtained for Catholics who make a pilgrimage to the Church of the Purification during Jubilee 2025. This will grant remission of temporal punishment for sin.

The requirements for the grace of a plenary indulgence are the ordinary established by the Catholic Church:

- Visit to the Pilgrimage
- An Act of Mercy or Penance
- Attend confession within 20 days of visiting the Pilgrimage site
- Receive Holy Communion within 20 days of visiting the Pilgrimage site
- Pray for the intentions of His Holiness Pope Francis at the Pilgrimage site

The Church of the Purification is open to pilgrims throughout the year during these days and times (subject to change-please check the church schedule).


March 17th Feast Day of St. Patrick

The timing of the presentations should take place between 3:00 – 3:30 pm in the Life Center.
