Twenty Third Sunday in Ordinary Time Cycle C

In today's gospel Jesus reminds his followers about the discipleship. Those who follow him are his disciples. Jesus says that anyone who wants to follow him must be ready to turn his back on family, on possessions, and even his own life. Let us be honest; Even people who go to the church don't usually think of our religion as calling for these kinds of sacrifices. In special situations some people may be called for martyrdom and great sacrifices. Even then the discipleship, following Christ is something serious. It touches us at a deeper level. It affects our values, our priorities and our loyalties, our whole way of looking at the world, at our work, at our lives and the lives of those close to us. There is a simple practical realism in Jesus' advice in today's gospel. He doesn't want people rushing headlong into instant commitment while ignoring the cost and their own capabilities. Discipleship involves having no security other than total commitment to Jesus. Out of many, two important aspects of following Jesus are mentioned in today's gospel: First, total renunciation and second, taking up the cross. First, "Ready to give up your love for your father and mother". We need to look at this difficult verse. Many English translations still say, "hate your father and mother". This is even more challenging. Jesus criticized the Pharisees for setting aside the law of God, which said, "Honor your father and mother" for the sake of their customs (Matt. 7:10-13). He could hardly be telling us now to hate them or give up our love for them. The problem is a too literal translation from another language. In Jesus' time the use of the verb "hate" would have been equivalent to "postponing" or putting in second place. In this sense we are not asked to cultivate hatred toward our loved ones. What this verse is saying is that discipleship is to come before all other relationships. Jesus said all these to the crowd who was following him that they must figure out the cost of discipleship, then consider whether they have the resources to meet that cost. So, what do these extraordinary demands of Jesus mean for ordinary people like us in our ordinary lives? Jesus says when it comes to following him, every other value or loyalty is subordinate. He compares it to being ready to carry a cross. Second taking up the cross: People could follow Jesus but without a cross, without a personal cost, without a sacrifice. The cross is the proving ground of our discipleship. It is where we show our fidelity, our loyalty to Christ. We all have cross. It is not a wooden cross. It can be the cross of a family problem, an illness, a troubling or troubled person at work. It can be a personality burden of our own that we have. It can be responsibilities we have or the cross of trying to be a family. Every cross is unique. Our cross is like our fingerprint. People may have the same illness, but the pain is experienced differently, uniquely, personally. Carrying cross is our way, our unique and very personal way of showing our fidelity to our Lord. There are other crosses we carry besides our personal crosses. These are crosses generated from the world in which we live. The past century has produced many crosses people had to endure. The world War1, the great depression, World War II, followed by Korean and Vietnam Wars and the threat of atheistic communism...9/11... constant threat from outside and for few years we are struggling with Covid-19. There is another kind of cross we carry as faithful members of the Church. That is the cross of handing on the faith to the next generation. It is never easy. The culture around has never made it easy. We carry all these crosses. We can either stare at the cross, complain about it, curse it, ignore it, deny it or follow Jesus by carrying it as faithfully as we can. We carry them not on our shoulders but in our heart near to the seat of the Lord. We are aware of the presence of the Lord and the cross at the same time. When we pray, we see both. The Lord is the strength and power to carry the cross. Because of his power we smile, laugh, do our responsibilities as if nothing is going on. Carrying the cross and following him make us his disciples. This is what St. Paul says in his letter to the Second Corinthians 6/8-11; "We are treated as dying and behold we live; as chastised and yet not put to death; as sorrowful yet always rejoicing; as poor yet enriching many; as having nothing and yet possessing all things."

The cross we have can change us in a very personal way from a fan of Christ into a disciple. Fr. Jacob Joseph

The goal of the LIFE CHAIN is to show respect for the sanctity of human life by standing for one hour in silent, peaceful witness and prayer. The McCormick



September 8th is the celebration of the birth of Mary. God chose Mary to be the Mother of Jesus. So open was she to God's action in her life that she was chosen to bring Christ to the waiting world. The Gospels are silent about her actual birth, but from the part she was to play in Christ's life, we know how special it was – even though the world did not know it at the time.

September 13 is the feast day of St. John Chrysostom. John was born around the year 347 in Antioch. His father died when he was a child, and so his mother guided his education. A gifted student, John studied under Libanius, a famous orator of his time. John considered himself too involved in the evils of the world. At eighteen, he experienced some type of religious conversion and began to study the Bible. Three years later, after the death of his mother, John went to join a group of monks living in the mountains. In 397 John was made the bishop-patriarch of Constantinople. A champion of charity and justice was not long before he stirred up the anger of empress Eudoxia and the jealousy of Theophilus ,patriarch of Alexandria. With such enemies mounting an attack against him, John was impeached and exiled. John was a powerful prophet of his day, he was not afraid to speak out against wrong, no matter who was involved..


