The St. Andrew Christmas Novena

Hail and blessed be the hour and moment in which the Son of God was born of the most pure Virgin Mary, at midnight, in Bethlehem, in piercing cold. In that hour vouchsafe, I beseech Thee, O my God, to hear my prayer and grant my desires, through the merits of Our Savior Jesus Christ, and of His Blessed Mother.



If the St. Andrew novena was prayed as a regular nine-day novena, it would end on the Feast of the Immaculate Conception on December 8th. However, this novena prayer is prayed much longer than nine days—it is prayed throughout all four weeks of Advent. It is piously believed that whoever recites the St. Andrew Christmas Novena Prayer FIFTEEN times each day from the feast of St. Andrew (November 30th) until Christmas Eve will obtain the favor requested.

FEAST OF OUR LORD JESUS CHRIST THE KING OF THE UNIVERSE

With this feast of Christ the King, we come to the end of another church year. The picture of Christ as King we are given is a powerful and majestic one. We honor the Lord Jesus today as a King whose Kingdom is eternal in time, universal in scope, and very personal in its power. That is the teaching of our readings. In the synoptic gospels, the central message of Jesus' teaching is the kingdom of God but in John's gospel the focus is on the Kingship of Jesus Christ. In today's gospel several times we hear the references to His Kingship and about his Kingdom. In answer to Pilate's question, Jesus said to him, "My kingdom is not from this world". We can easily fall into the temptation of interpreting this statement as a reference to a kingdom on an exclusively religious and spiritual level, with little or no incidence in the temporal realm, in concrete history. Such an interpretation does not correspond to the gospel as a whole. In his argument with the Pharisees Jesus said, as we read in John's gospel chapter 8 that "I am not of this world". This was the task of Jesus that to build a kingdom in this world and not of the world. He established a kingdom here on earth; it is a kingdom of love, peace, justice, truth, life, holiness and grace. Jesus received his authority or kingship in a unique way; it was not the way of the world. When he was tested before his ministry the devil took him up to a very high mountain and showed him all the kingdoms of the world in their magnificence, and he said to him, "All these I shall give to you, if you will prostrate yourself and worship me". Before his ascension he said to his disciples, "All power in heaven and earth has been given to me. Go, therefore, and make disciples of all nations" Jesus received his authority through his submission of his will to his heavenly Father. Jesus is the only King who shared his kingship with the citizens of his kingdom. In our baptism, as Christ is anointed as priest, prophet and king we are also anointed by the oil. The four unique characters of Christ's kingdom are then not from the world, not of the world, the authority came from God, and Kingship is shared.

The Lord's kingdom is not only enduring but also universal. It is wide enough, strong enough to embrace, heal and bring forgiveness to every human being however they may come to it. The kingdom of Jesus Christ is not only eternal but also universal. His kingdom is also personal. The kingdom of Jesus is not about castles, knights in armor, and grand military battles. It is about the liberation of our soul from sin and about setting us free to be the person God intends us to be. Jesus gives us the truth about our life, about ourselves, about our future. And His truth will always set us free.

The kingdom of Christ does not enslave us, but it sets us free. "My kingdom does not belong to this world," says Jesus to Pilate. Its power is not from this world, but from the grace and life of the Risen Christ. We are part of the kingdom of Christ. Jesus established his kingdom already here on earth. Using the grace and the power of the Risen Christ we need to live a life in the kingdom of God. We entered it through Baptism; were made stronger through Confirmation, sacrament of penance and communion, serve through Marriage and Holy Orders and healed through the Anointing of the Sick. When we have a life of love, forgiveness, joy and happiness we are enjoying the life of the kingdom of God.

The Lord wants us to make a kingdom of his; make our family a kingdom of his where people love each other, understand each other, help, forgive, tolerate, accept and recognize each other; a parish or a family of love, peace, justice, truth, life, holiness and grace. We live in the atmosphere of the kingdom of God, Christ is in our lives too. But many won't allow Christ to be part of their day-to-day actions. Many times, he is a stranger.

Earthly kingdoms will come and go. There were many kingdoms like Assyrian, Persian, Roman, British, Ottoman and it goes on. None of them exist now. None of these kingdoms or empires fell on a single day or a moment, it is a process. When people in the kingdom lose their faith in the kingdom it begins to fall. Only the kingdom of Christ is enduring and eternal. That is the teaching of the vision of Daniel. The celebration of this feast should help us to make our parish and families a kingdom of Christ where people love each other, forgive each other support and accept each other so that it may become a parish or a family of peace, love justice, truth, life holiness and grace.
