Twenty Seventh Sunday in Ordinary Time Cycle C 2025

Today's readings are all about faith and fidelity which is faith put into action. In the first reading the prophet Habakkuk, writing around 600 BC challenges God and calls him to account. The king of Babylon was plundering Israel. No human power was able to stop him. For centuries the prophets had been proclaiming God's justice. So why was the Lord allowing injustice to triumph? Even after centuries people ask the same question. Because the world faces the same situation as the violence of terrorism, attacks on human life, injustice from political powers, destruction from natural calamities. The Lord said three things to the prophet. First, the vision, the kingdom, still has its time. If it is delayed, wait for it. It will surely come. Second, write it down for all to read. Third, the just man because his faith in that vision, in the kingdom will be saved These are the three steps in the Lord's words to Habakkuk that are so important for our time and our life: having the vision in our life, planting the vision in our life, and trusting the vision to give us life.

First, there is having the vision. Whatever is going on in our world, we don't have to settle it as such. The violence of terrorism, war and attacks on human life that we see around us is not the way the world has to be. This may be the way it is but not the way it has to be.

Most of the great changes that have occurred in human history didn't simply happen. They happened through vision when people didn't settle for status as it is but looked beyond it. All the great changes that have occurred in individual lives have happened through vision where people didn't settle for anything as it is saying, "This is disability, this problem is mine, this sin of mine is there. This is nothing more than I can do about it." They looked beyond what they were to what they could become in Christ. Vision can change our world. Vision has changed our world.

Of course, there are good visions and bad ones. Hitler had a vision, our founder fathers had another. Islam has a vision; Hollywood has a vision. Christian has a vision which is peace and respect for human life. The question is: will the Christian faith of peace and respect for human life shape the future?

If we approach a thing saying 'it can't be done, it won't be. If we approach it saying it must be done, the chances are it will. That is the power of faith. And these are just human accomplishments. Imagine what is possible when God is involved.

In the second reading Paul is writing from prison. He sees his execution coming and this looks like a farewell letter to Timothy. He trusts in the Lord against all odds and tries to pass on that spirit to Timothy. He tells him to stand fast and not to abandon the faith. There can be many fears, anxieties and worries connected with life and Paul says that we must hold on to the faith that we received.

In the gospel the disciples asked the Lord, "Increase our faith." The context in which they ask to increase their faith is important. Before this request the Lord was talking about forgiveness. If your brother sins against you and comes back repenting, you must forgive him. Even if he sins seven times a day and comes back seven times repenting, you forgive him. Then the disciples said to the Lord "increase our faith." To forgive unconditionally everybody needs an increase in faith.

Faith strengthens us to go against the tide. It gives us power in moral weakness. Faith makes us love, not self-absorbed so that we take the future of our country, family, community and Church into account in our decisions. When so many people are weak, self-absorbed and short-sighted, our faith gives us power, love and self-control. In short, the theme of today's liturgy is faith. Faith is a light only for people who are searching. The moment we stop searching we no longer need the light. The end of the Gospel passage is a warning. We are capable of turning our faith into a crusade, an ego plan. But if after all our efforts we can still call ourselves unprofitable servants, the ego has nothing to cling to. The best example is the conclusion of the book of the prophet Habakkuk.

"For though the fig tree blossom not; No fruits be on the vines; though the yield of the olive fail; and the terraces produce no nourishment; though the flocks disappear from the fold; and there be no herd in the stalls; yet I will rejoice in the Lord; and exult in my saving God. God, my Lord, is my strength..." (Habakkuk 3: 17,18).

Spiritual Committee



A year ago, the Spiritual Committee, organized with several volunteers, began leading the rosary half an hour before the 4 pm Mass on Saturday and 11 am Mass on Sunday.

Some parishioners have asked for more personal prayer time before Mass. To accommodate them, our Spiritual Committee and volunteers will begin the rosary 40 minutes before Mass to allow 20 minutes for personal prayer time. There will be a container placed at the foot of the Blessed Mother statue so you may place your personal intentions for the rosary being prayed. These intentions will not be looked at or read aloud and after the 11 am Mass on Sunday each weekend, Fr. Jacob will dispose of all the written intentions.

Praying the rosary is a cherished practice in the Catholic faith that fosters spiritual growth, deepens one's relationship with God and serves as a powerful tool for meditation and reflection.

Spiritual Significance

- 1. **Meditation on the Life of Christ**: The rosary is often described as a compendium of the Gospel each set of mysteries—Joyful, Sorrowful, Glorious, and Luminous invites the faithful to reflect on key moments in the lives of Jesus and Mary. This contemplative practice helps deepen understanding of Christ's love and sacrifice.
- 2. **Connection to Mary**: The rosary is a way to honor the Virgin Mary and seek her intercession. By praying the rosary, Catholics believe they draw closer to Jesus through Mary, who is seen as a spiritual mother.
- 3. **Spiritual Protection and Strength**: Many believe that the rosary serves as a powerful weapon against evil and temptation. It is often described as a source of peace and comfort, helping to calm anxiety and strengthen faith during difficult times.

October 19th is World Mission Sunday. There will be a second collection that weekend.

World Mission Sunday stands as a powerful testament to our shared Catholic identity. As Pope Leo says, "Even today, there are many settings in which the Christian faith is considered absurd, meant for the weak and unintelligent. Settings where other securities are preferred, like technology, money, success, power, or pleasure. These are contexts where it is not easy to preach the Gospel and bear witness to its truth, where believers are mocked, opposed, despised or at best tolerated and pitied. Yet, precisely for this reason, they are the places where our missionary outreach is desperately needed. A lack of faith is often tragically accompanied by the loss of meaning in life, the neglect of mercy, appalling violations of human dignity, the crisis of the family and so many other wounds that afflict our society."

We will be taking photos for our new church directory during Oktoberfest in the Parish Life Center. Be sure to stop by and have your picture made—we want every family included.




ORDER OF CHRISTIAN INITIATION OF Adults Formerly Know as RCIA Program


