Twenty Eighth Sunday in OT C 2025

The word "Leprosy" terrified people in biblical times. Even today the word strikes our minds with fear. Shared misery had brought Jewish and Samaritan lepers together. Had they not been lepers they would never have been found in one another's company. The Samaritans and Jews despised each other but evidently this illness united these ten helpless and lonely individuals. It is said that in a flood, animals who are natural enemies of each other will stand side by side on dry ground as the water level rises. Crisis makes them allies. The same thing happened with these Jewish people and the Samaritan. There was a deep religious hatred between the Jews and the Samaritans. And the only leper who came back to give thanks to God was a Samaritan, a heretic.

Jews despised Samaria as a blot in their country. It was very inconveniently situated right in the middle of the country. So, when Jews wanted to travel between Galilee in the north and Judea in the south they had either pass through Samaritan country or go around it. Things could be unpleasant for them if they pass through, but journey was twice as long if they went around.

People may have a Samaritan territory in the middle of their life. It is part of your life that is a mess: where you are at your very weakest and worst, where your thoughts and motives are all mixed up and unclear, where you have no peace and hardly dare to hope for it. It can be a place that we do not want to go to, a person or a group of people or a family, we do not want to see or an incident that we do not want to remember.

But many of the heroes and heroines of Jesus' stories are Samaritans. The leper in today's reading, the good Samaritan, the Samaritan woman, Zacchaeus the tax collector from Jericho. This gives hope for all in His plan of salvation.

Another aspect of today's reading is to have a mind, full of thanks. All ten had their skin cured by Jesus. But only one of them, the Samaritan, was cured in his soul because the gift of healing and his gratitude for it brought him back to Jesus to express thanks. He then came to know Jesus not only as healer but as Savior. There is a very interesting fact about Naaman the Syrian in the first reading and the Samaritan leper. Both thank not only the prophet and Jesus; they thank God as well. They remind us to be grateful not only to other people who have been kind to us but also to God, who is the most generous of all. Today we are reminded how much we owe to a wonderfully kind and generous God who has poured down on us so many blessings.

There are so many good things in our lives that we tend to take for granted; many without thinking about it, we feel entitled. May be because of the prosperity that we have or had; we may feel that we have a right to all kinds of blessings. "Don't I have a right to be happy, a right to a long life, a right to good health, a right to some peace?" Are these rights or are they gifts and blessings. As long as we feel that these are blessings, not rights, the attitude of thanksgiving and praise will come from our mind. We can easily lose a sense of gratitude for the blessings we have been given.

The prayer of gratitude, of thanksgiving, widens our vision of God in our everyday life. It enables us to see the presence of God in every event in our life. One way that is the best way to give thanks to the Lord, is the celebration of the "Eucharist" which means thanksgiving. Whatever else we do at Mass, let us never forget to give thanks to the Lord. Ultimately, the prayer of thanksgiving doesn't benefit God, but benefits us.

All are encouraged to attend. This is a perfect opportunity to remember our deceased loved ones in a special way, as well as support our recently grieving parishioners and friends.




ORDER OF CHRISTIAN INITIATION OF Adults Formerly Know as RCIA Program


