Thirtieth Sunday in Ordinary Time Cycle C 2025

The Gospel reading gives us a short parable with a powerful message. The Pharisee came to the Temple and prayed, "Thank you, Lord, that I am not like the rest of the humanity especially that tax collector back there." Immediately a thought may come to the mind of the people that, "Thank you, Lord, I am not like that Pharisee in the parable." For us, the word "Pharisee" is almost synonymous with hypocrisy. In Jesus' time there were about 6000 Pharisees, and they were in charge of the local synagogues. The Sadducees oversaw the Jerusalem Temple. People in Israel could not travel to the Temple every Sabbath, so they had the local Synagogues where they could gather for what we today call "the liturgy of the word."

The Pharisees were devoted to the Law of Mosses. They were strict about doctrines but pragmatic in applying it. They interpreted the law. For example, the law said no work on the Sabbath. They began to define what is/is not work. A lawyer's delight. They knew, for example, that people could not stand in one place for the whole Sabbath, so they defined how far you could travel without breaking the Sabbath rest, the "Sabbath day journey." These interpretations of the law are collected in what is called the Talmud. Tax collectors worked for Rome, the occupying power, and were considered to be traitors and sinners. The Lord said this parable to us not to have a comparative study between the Pharisee and the tax collector. With this parable He is opening a new way to God through Him. The month of October gives us a list of great saints like, St. Francis of Assisi, St. Theresa of Avila, St. Ignatius of Antioch, St. Luke the Evangelist, the Apostles Simon and Jude, Our Lady of Rosary and St. Theresa of Child Jesus, the list goes on... We are unable to follow many of these saints. In the Gospel Jesus addresses people who pride themselves in their virtue while despising everyone else. They honor themselves by humiliating others. What Jesus says will come as a shock to their whole religious system. He declares that the tax-collector goes home justified while the pharisee does not. The tax collector gets much more than he asked for: he prayed for mercy but is now justified. In the judgement of Jesus everything is turned upside down. In the Gospel Jesus described as the friend of tax-collectors and sinners. Jesus does not put their sinfulness in hold but enlarges their world by calling them away from sinfulness into the freedom of God's mercy. For Jesus sinners were not just sinners, they were beloved sinners. They deserved more than the violence which keeps them oppressed in their wrongdoing, the violence which rubbishes them and writes them off.

If we come to pray and realize that our religion has a heavy investment in despising other people, then we will go home again as we come. "God, be merciful to us, sinners" is the whole truth and nothing but the truth. Anything else is for the mercy of God. St. Luke also gives another story like this. It is the story of the good thief crucified at the right side of the Lord in Calvary. Accepting his sins and condemnation, he said, "Jesus, remember me when you come into your kingdom." Jesus replied to him, "Amen, I say to you, today you will be with me in Paradise." (Lk. 23: 42-43). On October 1, we celebrate the feast of St. Theresa of child Jesus, who was always thinking and saying that she is a toy or an instrument in the hands of child Jesus. In her life we see the total emptiness of her- self and trust in the Lord which made her a great saint. When we think of the attitudes of these three people, the tax collector, the thief on the right-hand side of Jesus, and St. Theresa of child Jesus, we see a path or way to the Lord, a spirituality that can lead us to heaven by the mercy of God. Many of us cannot be like St. Francis of Assisi to have a life of complete renunciation, or the life of a mystic like St. Theresa of Avila or a glorious martyr like St. Ignatius of Antioch. We are called to have a humble life with strong faith and trust in the Lord. Therefore, throughout our life we call for the mercy of God for we are sinful people. That is our way of life, our spirituality.



WHAT IS FIRST FRIDAY DEVOTION???

A "First Friday" is the first Friday of the month and is often marked by special devotion to the Sacred Heart of Jesus since Jesus died for us and won our salvation on a Friday. Every Friday of the year, and not only the Fridays in Lent, is a special day of penance as stipulated in the Code of Canon Law. "The penitential days and times in the universal Church are every Friday of the whole year and the season of Lent" (Canon 1250).

St. Margaret Mary Alacoque (1647 – 1690) reported visions of Jesus Christ directing her to promote devotion to the Sacred Heart of Jesus on nine consecutive First Fridays in reparation for sins and in order to show love to Jesus. In return for this act of devotion, which usually includes Mass, Communion, confession and even an hour of Eucharistic Adoration on the eve of the first Friday of the month, our blessed Savior reputedly promised St. Margare Mary the following blessings: "In the excess of mercy of my Heart, I promise you that my all powerful love will grant to all those who will receive Communion on the First Fridays, for nine consecutive months, the grace of final repentance: they will not die in my displeasure, nor without receiving the sacraments; and My Heart will be their secure refuge in that last hour."

The devotion is officially sanctioned, but it was not so at first. In fact, St. Margare Mary met with resistance and incredulity from the start in her own religious community, and not until 75 years after her death was the First Friday devotion to the Sacred Heart officially recognized. Almost 240 years after her death, Pope Pius XI stated that Jesus had appeared to St. Margaret Mary in his encyclical *Miserentissimus Redemptor* (1920), fully eight years after she was formally canonized a saint by Pope Benedict XV.

First Friday devotions are held at 9 am here at Good Shepherd every First Friday of the month.


