MAY 11TH MAY CROWNING AT GOOD SHEPHERD



The modern May Crowning ceremony likely emerged in the 13th century, gaining prominence in the 19th century as a popular Marian devotion. During a May Crowning, a young girl, often wearing a white dress and veil, is chosen to crown the statue of the Blessed Mother with a wreath of flowers. This act symbolizes Mary's unique relationship with Christ and her role as the spiritual mother of all believers. In addition to the crowning of Mary's statue, the May

Crowning ceremony often includes the recitation of the Rosary, Marian hymns, and prayers honoring the Mother of God. These devotions reflect the deep reverence and love Catholics have for the Blessed Virgin, who is seen as a powerful intercessor and a model of faith, humility, and obedience. The May Crowning is a beautiful tradition that has been celebrated for centuries, connecting the faithful to the rich history of Marian devotion in the Catholic Church. By honoring the Blessed Mother during the month of May, the faithful are reminded of her maternal love and her role in the history of salvation, as the Mother of the Savior and the Mother of the Church.

Fourth Sunday of Easter C 2025

The image of the Shepherd which Jesus uses to explain his mission, both in the synoptic and in the gospel of John has a long history behind it. In the ancient Near East the king refers to himself as the good shepherd instituted by God. Pasturing sheep is an image of his task as a ruler. This image implies that caring for the weak is one of the tasks of the just ruler.

The immediate background of this image is found in the Old Testament. This image deeply shaped Israel's piety and people found consolation and confidence in it. The most beautiful expression is Psalm 23. "The Lord is my shepherd...Even though I walk through valley of the shadow of death, I fear no evil; for thou art with me" (Ps 23/3,4). The image of God as shepherd is more fully developed in the book of the prophet Ezekiel. "I myself will be the shepherd of my sheep. I will seek the lost and I will bring back the strayed, I will bind up the crippled, and I will strengthen the weak and the fat and the strong I will watch over" (Ez. 34/15-16). The prophet Zechariah gives the vision of a slain shepherd, who through his death becomes the Savior. Quoting from Zechariah St Matthew says, "I will strike the shepherd, and the sheep of the flock will be scattered" (Matt 26/31).

In the discourse about the good shepherd in John's gospel we see many ideas and points to be developed. A good shepherd is one who loves the sheep, cares for the sheep, protects the sheep knows the sheep and lays his life for the sheep. I like to expand only one point. The shepherd and the flock know each other. The shepherd knows the sheep because they belong to him. He does not possess the sheep as things, but they belong to him. Jesus says, "I am the good shepherd; I know my own and my own know me, as the Father knows me, and I know the Father and I lay down my life for the sheep." The mutual knowing of the shepherd and the sheep is interwoven with the mutual knowing of Father and Son. The knowing that links Jesus with "his own" or the sheep exists in his oneness with his Father.

The second reading describes the fulness of life beyond death: "a great multitude... from every nation, race, people, and tongue... stood before the throne... they will not hunger or thirst anymore... For the Lamb who is in the center of the throne will shepherd them and lead them to springs of life-giving water, and God will wipe away every tear from their eyes." Who are these people? Jesus tells us, "My sheep hear my voice; I know them, and they follow me. I give them eternal life, and they shall never perish. No one can take them out of my hand." Jesus promises three things to His sheep. i, He promises eternal life. ii, He promises us a life that will never end. Death will be not the end, but the beginning of an existence beyond our wildest dreams. Iii, He promises a life that is secure. Nothing can steal us away from him. We are subject to suffering, and sorrow and death, but even in our darkest hour, we have his pledge that we will never be alone.

Each sheep is connected to the shepherd through the Spirit or by grace so that they become one shepherd and one flock. They are one body and Jesus is the head. A shepherd in Jesus' service means that he or she has no right to bind men to himself or herself, to his or her own little "I". The mutual knowing that binds him to the sheep entrusted to his care must have different goals. It must enable them to lead one another into Christ and through him toward God; it must enable them to encounter each other in the communion formed around knowing and loving God. The shepherd in Jesus' service must always lead beyond himself to enable others to find their full freedom and therefore he must always go beyond himself into unity with Jesus and the Trinitarian God.

Those who are entrusted to take care of someone are pastors in a general sense. Priests, ministers, parents, teachers, those involved in health care are pastors. If anybody entrusted to the care of someone tries to bind men to himself based on race, culture, nationality, language or by any means he sins against the good shepherd in Christ Jesus. Let us be faithful to Jesus who wants us to share in his ministry in this world. In our caring for others the good Lord will help us, and he will be with us.
